#### President's Message

Spring weather is just around the corner! Punxsutawney Phil didn't see his shadow last month and per tradition, that means he is predicting an early spring. Spring is certainly close by - I've heard the chorus of the spring peepers!

The Board has been very busy the last several months. The annual meeting was reconvened on January 17th. At the meeting, all Board members were re-elected to another term. Ed Rose will now serve as Vice President and we are pleased to welcome back to the Board Peter Giguere, CPA who will serve as our Treasurer.

The budget meeting went forward on November 29th. During discussion, it was noted that assessments have not been increased in the past 4 years. In order to maintain healthy reserve funds and to keep up with rising costs, it was deemed necessary to increase quarterly assessments for 2024. By law, assessments may be increased by 10% per year, but it was decided to only increase assessments by 3% (an additional \$7.50/qtr.) beginning January 1st.

We managed to escape the snowy weather experienced by the northeast; however, we did receive a damaging rain and windstorm on January 9<sup>th</sup> which caused a tree to fall across Walnut Ridge Drive. Because Walnut Ridge Drive is a county-owned road, Management reported the incident to Anne Arundel County and the County Department of Public Works promptly removed the tree that same night. During the storm, it was reported that a light pole on Tanook had fallen. BGE was contacted and will be replacing the light pole in the coming weeks.

In early February, Level Green performed spring cleanup of our common areas which included mulching, weeding, cutback of the liriope and ornamental grass, leaf and debris removal. Back in October, Board Member Ed Rose walked the community with our go-to arborist from

Annapolis Tree Company and identified several areas of concern. In January and February, Annapolis Tree performed the much-needed pruning and/or removal of several trees, and removed lower branches which were hovering over the streets, sidewalks, parking lots and walkways.

After soliciting proposals for the replacement of the retaining wall and railing at 1352-1354 Tanook Court, Chamberlain Contracting was awarded the contract and that project began on March 4th with the installation of a new retaining wall. Installation of the new railing is planned for March 27th, weather permitting.

Bids are being solicited to rake, redistribute and spread additional mulch at the playground.

The Board has once again arranged for a dumpster to be delivered to the cul-de-sac in mid-July. Watch for more details in the Summer Newsletter.

In closing, I would like to extend a warm welcome to all our new residents and a very happy Spring season to all.



#### Trash & Recycling—Another Reminder

Plastic trash bags left out which contain food waste/scraps, cooking oil, diapers and pet waste are prime targets for vultures, rats and other pesky varmints. These animals will rip open the plastic bags, pull out the garbage and create an unsightly mess and a very unhealthy situation for you and your neighbors.

PLEASE! All trash and garbage should be placed out in tightly-covered trash cans/containers. Trash and garbage in tightly-covered containers will help keep birds and other unwanted animals away, will keep the wind out and will avoid trash being blown into the street and yards. To keep recyclables from blowing away, flatten boxes and milk jugs, don't overfill your recycling bin and place heavier items on top.

As a reminder, trash and recycling containers should be placed at the curb no earlier than 6:00 pm on Monday evenings. Containers should be out before 6:00 am on Tuesday mornings to ensure pickup. Containers should not be placed on the common areas or at the mailbox stations. Trash and recycling containers should be taken in no later than Tuesday evening. Trash and recycle containers should be stored out of sight and not visible from the street and/or sidewalk. Your cooperation is paramount in keeping our community aesthetically attractive, maintain property values and curb appeal.

#### Campaign Sign Reminder



Campaign signs are not to be posted on community property. Posting campaign signs on your own property is fine. If a sign has been posted on community property, it will be removed.
